



Collective Bargaining and Union Dues

If voted in, the union will typically collect dues from you in exchange for negotiating a labor contract on your behalf.

But here's the thing about collective bargaining:

- 1.** Unions often propose a clause in the contract that requires employers to fire employees who haven't paid their dues or fees.
- 2.** There are no guarantees. You could end up with less, more, or the same as you have now.
- 3.** If you don't like the final contract, there is no opt out option, you must follow it. So you could be stuck paying dues and following a contract that you do not like.
